On Tuesday July 4, the Riders joined the rest of the Post Family hosting a special event called "Escape the Fireworks" for veterans who deal with PTS and other post family members who struggle with fireworks. The night started off with usual 4th of July food and finished off with interactive games, music provided by DJ Dennis, a food eating contest and essay contest with the winner getting a custom-made set of cornhole boards valued at \$350 donated by Kyle Dudley of Dudley Wood Shop Nanjemoy, MD. (240) 682-0788 On Saturday July 8, The Riders with 6 motorcycles participated in ride hosted by Post 22 Towson, MD benefiting Hero Dogs. The ride raised over \$10K to train service dogs to help veterans deal with PTS and other debilitating diseases. The ride was about 76 miles round trip with one stop at Post 200 Hampstead, MD. On return to Post 22 the Riders were treated to a delicious lunch and camaraderie with other Legion Riders from across MD.

On Wednesday July 12, 7 Riders and 1 cage took a very nice early morning ride to Ocean City, MD for The MD State Convention. On this day GSLR Chairman Joe Gladden presented a check to the Department for \$210,000 raised from the MDGSLR back in June. Joe also gave out 10 awards to the top donors in the State. Our Post 82 Family donated a whopping \$50,680 which was only out done by Laurel Post 60 which garnered top honors with \$51,800. The Riders had a late donation of \$2,430 which was earmarked for the GSLR but was not received before the cut-off date. Our total contribution was \$53,110! If on your travels, you see anyone from Laurel Post 60 please congratulate them on an outstanding job.

On Saturday July 15, 16 Riders and 2 passengers participated in a Poker Run to raise money for cancer research for Finn's Fierce Fight against DIPG. Finn is an 8-year-old boy suffering from a very rare form of brain cancer that has no treatment available. To the best of my knowledge over \$4,000 was raised on this day. Please keep Finn and his family in your prayers.

On July 26 we partnered with the Patriot Guard Riders to escort Post 82 member MSgt Clemen Noland (USAF) to his final rest in Cheltenham Veterans Cemetery. Commander Zayas and Past Chaplain Flatley presented the American Legion Funeral Service at Cheltenham.

On Saturday July 29, the Riders along with the Patriot Guard escorted Marine Cpl. Khachadurian to the Community Kick-Off spearheaded by Homes for Our Troops. This Kick-Off signifies the start of the Smart Home that will be built for Cpl. Khachadurian who lost both legs, several fingers on his left hand and

also severe damage to his left forearm after stepping on an IED during a patrol in Afghanistan. The welcome to the community took place at Gracie's Event Center (Middleton Hall) in Waldorf. There will be a future escort and open house once Cpl. Khachadurian new home is completed.

The Riders are making plans to ride The National Gold Star Legacy Ride 2023 which starts in Kokomo IN on August 20 traveling through Michigan, Ohio, West Virginia, Virginia, Kentucky, and Tennessee before the final stop at Hendrick Motorsports campus in Concord, NC. close by The AL National Convention in Charlotte NC on August 24.
