Legion Membership Report

Greetings Legionaries and all of those who support American Legion Post 82. We've had a phenomenal year in membership. Not only did we exceed expectations, but we were also recognized as Southern Maryland Region's top post for Category 4 at the recent SMR Oyster bowl event. In fact, Post 82 topped all Category 4 Posts throughout the state with 107% recruitment and 92% renewals. We have held the top spot for several weeks in a row. As of May 19, we have 775 active members! With my membership team's continued commitment, we are hoping to hold on to that spot through June 30.

To remain ahead of the pack on membership renewals, and to save you money, we have been encouraging folks to renew online for up to three years at the current rate of \$35.00 and save before dues increase to \$45.00 on Jul 1st. So far, 57 Post 82 Legionnaires have taken advantage

of this opportunity. That means 534 personnel with annual renewals may incur the extra cost of \$10.00 per year after the deadline. If you need help doing so, please reach out to me, the Post Commander, or the Adjutant for assistance.

Since our last post newsletter, we have had three legionnaires report to Post Everlasting and we performed the American Legion Post Everlasting ceremony for each. We had several Post members participate in them and I offer my thanks to each of you.

As a retired Navy submariner, I have often heard of our shipmates passing away and going on "Eternal Patrol", but I must confess that it wasn't until I was in the position of Post Chaplain that I heard of our "Post Everlasting" service. The script that we use for the service makes it clear that the Post Everlasting is an appropriate metaphor for our eternal home with God in heaven. The

following are excerpts from the prayers included in the script.

"Eternal God, Supreme Commander of us all, Lord of the far-flung battle line to whom the ranks of life report, we bow before You with reverent hearts, and in sublime faith, know that You lead us on in death as You have in life."

"With the faded blossoms of springtime and the withered leaves of autumn, You have called our friend to eternal peace, to the land of your silent mystery."

"Until for us, the day breaks and the shadows flee, may we live our lives in a way that we may honor the Legionnaires who have gone before us. Together may we come to the city which You have prepared for those who love You."

There are many Bible verses that support the concept of Post Everlasting as presented in the script and I offer the following for your consideration:

John 14:2 NIV

My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you?

2 Corinthians 5:1 NIV

"For we know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands."

Hebrews 11:16 NIV

But as it is, they desire a better country, that is, a heavenly one. Therefore, God is not ashamed to be called their God, for he has prepared for them a city.

Revelation 21:3-4 NIV

"And I heard a loud voice from the throne saying, "Behold, the dwelling place of God is with man. He will dwell with them, and they will be his people, and God himself will be with them as their God. He will wipe away every tear from their eyes, and death shall be no more, neither shall there be mourning, nor crying, nor pain anymore, for the former things have passed away."

For the information of those who haven't participated in one of these services, the primary speaking roles in it are performed by the Post Commander and Post Chaplain. Upon finishing the closing prayer, the Chaplain turns to the casket or urn, renders a hand salute, and simply states "Farewell our friend and fellow each Legionnaire." Then of the other Legionnaires present, file by, render a hand salute and make the same or a similar statement.

Over this past year, I have participated in the Post Everlasting services of several members of our Post and in each case the family members were very appreciative of our participation. Typically, our service lasts about 15 minutes and upon its completion most of the Legionnaires depart, though we are welcome to stay for the following funeral of course.

Not all Legionnaires' families will request our Post Everlasting service, but when they do, as Legionnaires, it is our honor and duty to support them by participating in this brief but meaningful service that provides a solemn blend of solace for the family, recognition of their loved one's service to our nation and the American Legion, and reference to their religious belief system. I share all this to hopefully encourage more Post members to participate in future Post Everlasting services. Thank you in advance for your support.

A Caregiver's Journey with Advance Care Planning.

Seventy-five-year-old Vietnam War Army Veteran Rick Tupper started experiencing complications from heart disease, diabetes and dementia. His challenges became more acute when he accidentally took too much medication one day. It was then that his wife Tina realized he needed more care and support, so she retired early to become his full-time caregiver. Tina soon realized she was in uncharted territory.

Tina's path to wellness centered on Rick's dementia diagnosis. His psychiatrist recommended that she join the <u>VA Advance Care Planning via Group Visits Program</u>. Tina dove into the caregiver support group, attending weekly meetings to gather strategies for managing Rick's care and maintaining her own well-being.

Caregiving is not a journey to be taken alone.

Tina credits the transformative impact of the program and VA services for the couple's adjustment to recent changes. Despite the financial strain of early retirement, she feels equipped to handle the changes, knowing she has the necessary tools and support systems in place. She thanks VA for helping maintain their quality of life as much as possible given their circumstances.

Tina highlights the sense of belonging and understanding that comes from connecting with others facing similar challenges. Through these

interactions, she has not only received practical advice but also found emotional solace in knowing she's not alone on this journey.

She also encourages caregivers to remember the importance of seeking help and prioritizing self-care. She acknowledges the tendency to feel isolated but encourages others to lean on VA resources for guidance and support. She feels the role of caregiver support programs is vital in navigating the complexities of caring for a loved one. Through education, community and access to resources, she found empowerment and resilience in the face of adversity.

VA Advance Care Planning via Group Visits Program

The ACP-GV program provides group settings at local VA facilities for caregivers to discuss advance care planning and learn from each other's personal experiences. They can attend on their own or bring someone from their personal support system. Veterans are always welcome. You can contact the local <u>ACP-GV site lead</u> for current group offerings.

Caregiver Support Program

CSP promotes the health and well-being of Veterans' caregivers through education, resources, support, and services. Every VA facility has a CSP team that provides valuable information about resources to help caregivers stay informed and supported as they support Veterans. More information can be found on CSP's website and by contacting local CSP teams. To learn more, watch CSP's SITREP podcast.

Post 82 Member Receives Bronze Star for Service in Vietnam

In July of 2023, John C. "Chris" Lowe, and the members of Company B "Bushwhackers" of the 720th MP BN were awarded the Bronze Star for Meritorious Service for action in Vietnam. "The Army finally recognized, after 52 years, that we were the only MP company in the history of the Army that ever-performed infantry duty!" 56 members of the Bushwhackers receive the Bronze Star in a ceremony at the Capitol building in Wash DC.

Chris was born and raised in White Plains. In the summer of 1969, he reported to Post 82 where he joined other recruits and began his Army service via the processing center at Fort Holabird in Baltimore on August 19, 1969. Chris served in Vietnam for 14 months in what I can best describe as extreme and unique circumstances.

Decades after their service ended, members of Chris's Unit sought awards of Combat Infantry Badges (CIB). While they were denied the CIB, the entire unit was recognized for their unique service when they were all awarded the Bronze Star.
