"He is risen!" "He is risen, indeed!"
So how was your "March Madness" experience, aside from the NCAA basketball tournaments? Between college kids being home for spring break, younger ones being out of school as well, perhaps a family trip to a warmer climate, sport practices and games for the kids and grandkids, and some crazy weather events, March can be a pretty maddening month for many of us. So very maddening that we almost forget to shop for Easter baskets and flowers for our loved ones, and sad to say, that many of us will spend little time considering the ultimate reason behind these purchases – recognizing the end of Lent and the celebrations of Good Friday and

The good news is, first and foremost, that through Christ's death and resurrection we have been redeemed.

1 Peter 1:3 (NIV)

Resurrection (Easter) Sunday.

"Praise be to the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ! In his great mercy he has given us new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead,"

Luke 24:6 – 7 (NIV)

"He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: 'The Son of Man must be delivered over to the hands of sinners, be crucified and on the third day be raised again."

Romans 6:9 – 10 (NIV)

"For we know that since Christ was raised from the dead, he cannot die again; death no longer has mastery over him. The death he died, he died to sin once for all; but the life he lives, he lives to God."

And for those of us who got caught up in the madness of this past March and didn't give as much thought to the 'reason for this season' as we would have liked to, there is the additional good news that we don't have to wait for that one weekend a year to celebrate Christ's resurrection from death to life for our redemption but can and should do so on a daily basis, wherever we are and whatever our circumstances.

So, by humbly serving one another in love, loving our neighbors as ourselves, and displaying the fruit of the Spirit in our daily lives, we can celebrate Christ's resurrection from death to life for our redemption 365 days a year and not just one weekend in March. S.A.L. Monthly Meetings are held the First Tuesday of Each Month at 1800hrs

During the Squadron meeting on March 5, the members voted to donate \$1,000 to the Post 82 American Legion baseball team, \$300 to the La Plata High School (LPHS) Navy Junior Reserve Officers' Training Corps (NJROTC) air rifle team, and \$200 to the LPHS NJROTC color guard. We also selected a member of the Charles County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) as the Squadron's First Responder of the Year. Arrangements will be made to present the winner with a plaque and a donation of \$100 will be made in his name to the CCSO Special Events Fund.

We served over 198 dinners at the Fish Fry March 15. Due to the success of the first two fish fries, the Squadron has decided to have one more on April 19. The fish fry will consist of two whiting fillets, green beans, cole slaw, hush puppies, fries, tea, and coffee. The cost is \$15. Do you know a high school Junior who is interested in government, politics, leadership, attendance at Military Academy, College ROTC, or just a challenging academic program? The American Legion and American Legion Auxiliary have two very worthwhile programs at the Department (State), Boys State and Girls State with an opportunity to be elected/selected to participate in Boys or Girls Nation programs. Boys State and Girls State are considered among the most respected and selective educational programs of government instruction for U.S. highschool students. Attendance at Boys/Girls State carries the same weight on a résumé as earning the distinction of Eagle Scout, especially when applying to US military schools and academies.

The tuition costs for Boys State are 100% covered by the local Legion Post or Department. Likewise, Girls State tuition is 100% covered by the local Auxiliary Unit with a registration fee of just \$40. Both programs are available to any 2023-2024 High School Junior (no Legion affiliation/membership is required) with at least 1 semester remaining in their senior year and have not participated or are planning to participate in any other Boys/Girls State Program

In the past, Post 82 and Unit 82 have each sent upwards of 15 students per year. This year we'd like to ramp back up and send at least 10 juniors to each program. (Students should apply to the Post/Unit closest to their residence.)

Boys State Maryland will be held June 16-22, 2024, at McDaniel College in Westminster, MD

Girls State Maryland will be held June 16-21, 2024, at Salisbury College in Salisbury, MD.

The application portals for both programs are open now through May 1, 2024.

American Legion, Department of Maryland 2024 General Scholarship Application

Eligibility:

- 1. Be a child or grandchild of a veteran (must show proof of veteran status, military discharge, or DD-214).
- 2. Be a Maryland resident.
- 3. Not have attained your 20th birthday by January 1, 2024.
- 4. Be a full-time student when he/she enters college (at least 12 credit hours per semester).
- 5. Complete and submit application with all supporting documents. The application form must be submitted with three reference letters, a short essay on why you think you deserve the scholarship, copies of your high school transcripts and SAT Score results. Applications are due to the Department by mail or online submission on or before April 15, 2024.

Winners will be announced in August 2024.
