Chaplains Corner

How was your month of June? How many of the literally 250+ daily holidays in June did you celebrate, such as Father's Day, U.S. Army Birthday, D-Day, Juneteenth, Take Your Cat to Work Day, World Motorcycle Day, and National Bingo Day?

Did you observe any of the weekly or monthly observances such as Stepparents' Week, National Tennis Week, Animal Rights Awareness Week, Caribbean American Heritage Month, Pride Month, or National PTSD Awareness Month?

On a personal level, I only celebrated Father's Day and World Motorcycle Day, as I had little idea of, or connection with, most of the other celebratory days and observances. The one that I became aware of this past month that really hit home was that of June being PTSD Awareness

Month. It seems to receive so little recognition on social media and in the press.

This struck me as tragic when I learned that in the United States alone, there are about 12 million people battling posttraumatic stress disorder. Not all of them are adults, nor are they all veterans. Many are civilians, survivors of sexual and/or physical assault, serious accidents, or any number of other traumatic life events.

According to the US Department of Veterans Affairs, there are effective PTSD treatments in existence, but most victims of PTSD don't get the treatments they need due to a lack of awareness of them or reluctance to admit or recognize their need for it. The failure of military veterans to get treatment for PTSD contributes significantly to the figure of "22 a day", the average number of American military veterans committing suicide on a daily basis.

What are the symptoms of PTSD?

PTSD symptoms usually start soon after traumatic events, but they may not appear until months or years later. They also may come and go over many years. If the symptoms last longer than 4 weeks, cause you great distress, or interfere with your work or home life, you might have PTSD.

According to the VA, there are four types of PTSD symptoms. To be clinically diagnosed with PTSD, you need to have each type. That said, everyone experiences symptoms in their own way.

- 1. Reliving the event (also called re-experiencing symptoms). Memories of the traumatic event can come back at any time. They can feel very real and scary.
- 2. Avoiding things that remind you of the event. You may try to avoid situations or people remind you of the trauma event.
- 3. Having more negative thoughts and feelings than before the event. The way you think about yourself, and others may become more negative because of the trauma.

4. Feeling on edge or keyed up (also called hyperarousal). You may be jittery, or always alert and on the lookout for danger. You might suddenly become angry or irritable.

By being aware of these symptoms and in turn recognizing them in yourself or others, hopefully you would seek help for yourself as needed, or encourage others who need to seek it, to do so. Having gained this knowledge, I have added those in general who are suffering from PTSD to my prayer list, and I encourage you to do so as well. Additionally, I offer a prayer for them below. Heavenly Father,
